CDM Regulations Awareness

Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007

Suitable For:

This course is designed for anyone appointed as a key duty holder under CDM Regulations i.e. clients, designers, principal contractors, contractors / self-employed persons and CDM Coordinators. It will also be of benefit to anyone requiring an overview of the Regulations, such as managers and supervisors who have responsibilities for managing construction projects.

Course Aim:

This course is designed to provide candidates with a knowledge and understanding of the CDM Regulations and provide a valuable insight into the legal aspects and practical requirements for their respective role.

Course Content will include:

- Overview of associated legislation (including: The Health and Safety at Work Act 1974)
- CDM terminology
- CDM application and notification
- The five phases of a construction project
- CDM Regulations; where they apply
- Duties of Clients, Designers, CDM Co-ordinator, Principal Contractor and Other Contractors
- Pre-construction information
- Construction phase
- The Health and Safety File
- Competence and Resources
- Management and control of contractors

The course content can be customised and individual subjects can be expanded to suit company requirements.

On successful completion of this course, candidates will be able to interpret and understand the requirements of the CDM Regulations, including the responsibilities of the key duty holders, the requirements for notifying certain projects and the requirements for a health & safety file.
